In the beginning of 2007, Colorado L-449 qualified instructors received a number of requests from participants in ICS 300 and ICS 400 level courses to create a workshop to specifically address the incident command system forms and how they come together to create a written incident action plan.

Workshop participants are immersed in the process of using, communicating and understanding the ICS forms, various plans and position checklists. By workshop end participants will understand the production of a full incident action plan. Participants will also receive instruction on the creation of the demobilization plan, transition plans, incident complexity analysis, and ICS 209 intelligence summary and the after action process. This workshop will build on the concepts of NIMS and the September 2005 version of the national all hazard curriculum.

Instructors of this course are certified ICS instructors and are also members of organized incident management teams, qualified in the planning section. In 2008, instructors have been involved in incidents in Park County, Alamosa and Windsor as part of an incident management team.
